New Play Facilities - Phase 1

Despite much chasing, we have been unable to obtain a firm date from the contractors to complete outstanding works at the play park. Current indications are week commencing 11th December, which we hope will be confirmed very soon.

Although the park looks ready for use, there is currently no safety flooring under the train and the fencing needs to be replaced. Most importantly, the independent safety sign off report has not been finally signed off. The Parish Council must put safety of the equipment first and this is why the park has not re-opened.

As soon as the last stages of work are completed, and on receipt of the safety report, the play park will be opened for the children. We are still planning to organise an official opening, to take place later, sometime in the New Year, which we hope residents and their families will attend. We will keep you informed via usual channels – village noticeboards at the crossroads, on-site and website www.witchamparishcouncil.gov.uk
